

**Prof. Mike McNamee** is Professor of Applied Ethics in the College of Engineering at Swansea University, Wales, UK. He teaches and publishes on ethical theory and practice in the areas of engineering, medical, research, and sports. He is a former President of the International Association for the Philosophy of Sport, the Founding Editor of *Sport, Ethics and Philosophy*, and Co-Editor of Routledge's book series "Ethics and Sport". He has published widely on issues including disability sports, doping, Olympic philosophy and ethics, sports medicine ethics, research ethics. Among his books (Routledge) are "Sports, Virtues and Vices" (2008), "Ethics, dis/Ability and sports" (2009); "Sports Ethics: a reader" (2010), while his latest book "Sport, Medicine, Ethics" will be published in 2014. He has served on Executive Committees and Boards including the European College of Sport Science, the European Commission Expert Group on Anti Doping in Recreational Sport, the International Council for Sport Science and Physical Education, and founded the British Philosophy of Sport Association. His current research is on biomedical technology and research, injury repair and recovery, and their ethical governance. He is a lifelong lover of sports and still runs and plays tennis.
